A BILL

To direct the Secretary of the Interior to conduct a special resource study to evaluate the significance of the 1816 Farmington Quaker Meetinghouse located in Farmington, New York, and the suitability and feasibility of its inclusion in the National Park System as part of Women's Rights National Historical Park, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. THE 1816 FARMINGTON QUAKER MEETING-**
2 **HOUSE STUDY.**

3 (a) DEFINITIONS.—For the purposes of this Act:

4 (1) 1816 FARMINGTON QUAKER MEETING-
5 HOUSE.—The term “1816 Farmington Quaker
6 Meetinghouse” means the 1816 Farmington Quaker
7 Meetinghouse listed on the National Register of His-
8 toric Places, and located in Farmington, New York.

9 (2) SECRETARY.—The term “Secretary” means
10 the Secretary of the Interior .

11 (b) STUDY.—Not later than 2 years after the date
12 that funds are made available for this section, the Sec-
13 retary shall conduct a special resource study to evaluate
14 the significance of the 1816 Farmington Quaker Meeting-
15 house in Farmington, New York, as well as the suitability
16 and feasibility of its inclusion in the National Park System
17 as part of the Women’s Rights National Historical Park.

18 (c) CONTENT OF STUDY.—The study shall include an
19 analysis of the following:

20 (1) The significance of the 1816 Farmington
21 Quaker Meetinghouse in relation to the Under-
22 ground Railroad and the history of the United
23 States.

24 (2) Opportunities for public enjoyment of
25 the 1816 Farmington Quaker Meetinghouse as part
26 of Women’s Rights National Historical Park.

1 (3) Any operational, management, and private
2 property issues that need to be considered if the
3 1816 Farmington Quaker Meetinghouse were added
4 to Women's Rights National Historical Park.

5 (4) A determination of the feasibility of admin-
6 istering the 1816 Farmington Quaker Meetinghouse,
7 considering its size, configuration, ownership, costs,
8 and other factors, as part of Women's Rights Na-
9 tional Historical Park.

10 (5) An evaluation of the adequacy of other al-
11 ternatives for management and resource protection
12 of the 1816 Farmington Quaker Meetinghouse.

13 (d) SUBMISSION OF REPORT.—Upon completion of
14 the study, the Secretary shall submit a report on the find-
15 ings of the study to the Committee on Energy and Natural
16 Resources of the Senate and the Committee on Natural
17 Resources of the House of Representatives.
