**General Gordon Granger and Juneteenth**

Presentation by Peter Evans, Wayne County Historian. Granger issued General Order No. 3 on June 19, 1865, in Galveston, TX, informing residents of Lincoln's 1863 Emancipation Proclamation freeing all enslaved people in the states of the Confederacy.
